There are seven centers in the world for Rotary Foundation's International Studies in Peace and Conflict Resolution, part of a global program to advance research, teaching, practical training and knowledge on issues of international relations, conflict resolution and peace-building. It offers a tailored Master's Degree in International Studies, aimed at potential world and

community leaders, designed to have a practical effect on addressing international and regional conflicts. The seven centers are Duke University and University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill USA, International Christian University, Tokyo Japan, University of Bradford, West Yorkshire England, Uppsala University, Uppsala Sweden, Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok, Thailand, Makerere University, Kampala, Uganda and University of Queensland, St. Lucia, Australia.
