The 1.2 million Rotarians who make up more than 35,000 Rotary clubs in over 200 countries in the world share a dedication to the idea of


Rotary provides service to others, promotes integrity, and advances world understanding, goodwill, and peace through our fellowship of business, professional, and community leaders.


items, please bring them with you to our meeting tonight.
