The Rotary Club of Minnesota Veterans was the first of its kind The



cause based club specifically Club of Minnesota formed to serve veterans. club was chartered in October 2019.

"People think of Rotarians as all older white men, but that's not what it's about, especially with this club," said Tom Gump, club founder. Gump did not serve in the military, but he came up with the idea of a veterans' club after hosting a dinner for 200 veterans in July 2019. Tom has been inspirational in starting several Rotary clubs and has personally invited hundreds of men and women to become Rotarians and live lives of Service Above Self.

"I've been in Rotary for many years and I've never figured out a way to bring a bunch of new people in until now," said Gump. "This is really filling a niche for both veterans and non-veterans."



Its membership includes men and women from their 20s to 90s. Some had served in the military for a few years, some for decades.

For all of them, the club offers a chance to continue practicing the selfless service instilled in them in the military.

The club's three pillars are service, camaraderie and peace.

According to Rotary International, at the time the club was chartered, it was the only one in the world for veterans working to serve other veterans. Membership is not limited to those with military experience, but the group's service projects will focus on assisting vets.

The services that the Rotary Club of Minnesota Veterans provides include actively caring for one another and extended families - especially during times of hurt; serving in their communities - youth, civic organizations, schools and the elderly; duly honoring other veterans and their families - especially during times of grief; and serving those in area/regions where we have served, such as projects in Afghanistan, Iraq, Syria, Somalia, etc.

The Minnesota Veterans Rotary Club is also committed to strengthening the community and helping meet hospital and patient needs through blood donations. Blood drives are a way of giving the community an opportunity to help save lives.
